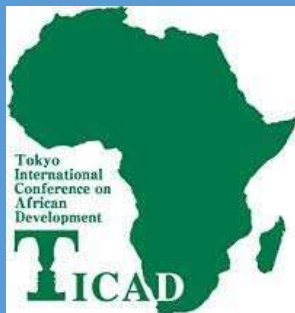

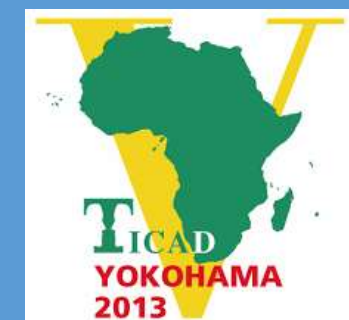

About TICAD

Tokyo International Conference on African Development

“The most traditional forum with African countries”

In the past, the assistance to Africa was driven by Western countries, but as the Cold War ended in the 1990s, interests in African development started to fade gradually among the developed countries.

Under that circumstance, Japan has advocated the importance of Africa, and launched TICAD in 1993 as a proof of its commitment to promote high-level policy dialogue between African Leaders and development partners on the issues facing Africa, such as economic development, poverty and conflict.

Currently, there are various forums between Africa and other countries, but TICAD is the pioneer for the forums on African development.

Ownership and Partnership



“Twin Principles of TICAD”

TICAD is an open and inclusive forum built on the twin principles of “African ownership” and “international partnership”. It mobilizes global support for Africa’s development by promoting continuous dialogue, collaboration, and voluntary initiatives among a wide range of actors.

Africa's Ownership



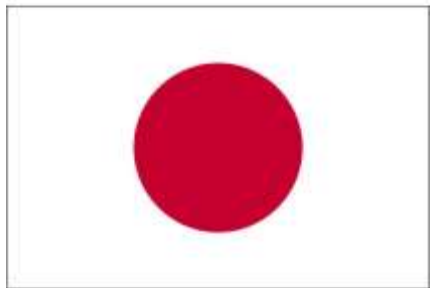
TICAD is a process in which Africa draws up a brilliant blueprint for its own development and, therefore, aligned with Africa's own agenda based on the conviction that Africa's socio-economic transformation is central to global stability and prosperity.

It prioritizes Africa's agenda, respects the continent's dignity, and uses a pragmatic development paradigm and modalities to bring concrete results to support Africa's Development Agenda.

International Partnership



- TICAD is co-organized by Japan, WB, UN, UNDP and AUC.
- TICAD engages multiple stakeholders : all African countries and development partners including international/regional organizations, donor nations, Asian countries, the private sector and civil society organizations.



Steady Fulfilment of Promise



TICAD has a three tier Follow-up Mechanism

- (1) Joint Secretariat
- (2) Joint Monitoring Committee
- (3) Followup Meetings (Ministerial Meetings, Senior Officials' Meetings)

TICAD is changing



“From Aid to trade, from Debt to Investment”

- The bond that TICAD has nurtured with Africa is not limited to inter-governmental cooperation. TICAD has consistently promoted private investment and trade in Africa.
- TICAD is the very process that connects the public and private sectors.
- Japanese private sectors will support the development of Africa through their insights and technologies.

Misunderstanding?

- TICAD is not a place where you apply for financial assistance for specific individual projects nor is it for pledging a certain amount of such assistance.
- At TICAD VI, Japan announced that it would invest for the future of Africa through implementing measures amounting to approximately USD 30 billion under public-private partnership for the period of three years from 2016 to 2018. This commitment was made for Africa as a whole, not for specific countries nor regional areas in Africa.
- Japan's initiatives under TICAD are diverse including loan, grant and technical cooperation, scholarship and each initiative has its own criteria and procedures. They are all included in the said USD 30 billion that Japan pledged at TICAD VI.

Date & Venue: 28-30 August 2019, Yokohama

There are three major themes for TICAD 7:

- 1 Accelerating Economic Transformation and Improving Business Environment through Innovation and Private Sector Engagement
- 2 Deepening Sustainable and Resilient Society
- 3 Strengthening Peace and Stability

Theme 1



The first theme is to promote economic transformation and to improve business environment and institution through innovation and private sector involvement. This can be achieved by:

(a) further promoting public-private dialogue between Africa and Japan,

(b) developing human resources through vocational training and investment, and

(c) supporting in quality infrastructure, enhancing connectivity and promote blue economy, among others.

Theme 2



The second theme is to promote resilient and sustainable society for human security. This includes:

- (a) achieving SDGs and Agenda 2063,
- (b) promoting health including through Universal Health Coverage (UHC),
- (c) utilizing Japan's technology and experience in such area as STI (Science, Technology and Innovation), education, environment and disaster risk management, and empowering women and youth.



Theme 3

The third theme is “Peace and Stability”, under which participants confirm the significance of supporting peacebuilding and institution building, improve public safety, and develop human resources in the area of peacebuilding.

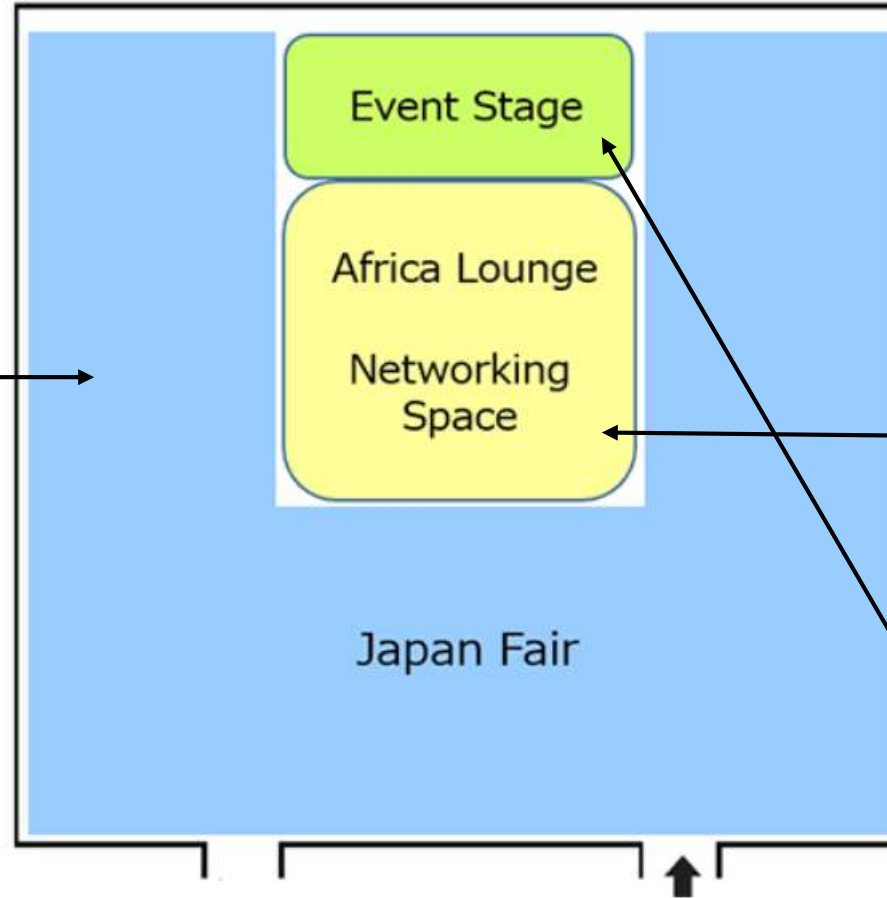
